Aloha Dr. Wallace ~

Hope you had an inspirational graduation week. Truly need your leadership now. Imagine a HHS teacher or staff resigns, yet uses official school stationary to spread misinformation. You would act immediately. Or possibly a nefarious party distributes notices on official-looking media directing students to the wrong location for the upcoming football game. You might contact authorities.

We agree there has been tension in our committee deliberations. On May 22, 2024, members met, discussed and stepped down. Jeff Waldron notified me May 23, 2024. As class president, I accepted the resignations and formed the ad hoc Reunion 50 committee, with at least two members, and invited Jeff to serve with me. Jeff declined.

I asked members to forward all Class of 1975 materials to me. Ann Jesse Driever promised to transfer the Class of 1975 funds; Jeff promised to transfer the Class of 1975 Facebook page. Both have refused. Susan Mattivi-Giega refuses to transfer the most-updated Class of 1975 roster.

I spoke with an attorney today. He asked two questions:

1. Have the Members provided any justification or explanation for actions and refusal to cooperate with your efforts?
2. How has the use of your copyrighted intellectual property on Waldron's Facebook project affected the perception and communication among classmates?

Answer #1: No. The three refuse to cooperate or communicate.

Answer #2:

Jeff refuses to transfer the Facebook page, continues to “advertise” previous committee notices and directs classmates to contact members no longer associated with the reunion effort. Jeff “stole” copyrighted content from the official Reunion 50 website, and posted to Class of 1975 Facebook page. This imagery implies official status. The information is incorrect — confusing and misleading classmates. I requested Jeff stop. He blocked my access to the page. This behavior violates copyright law, and is fraudulent and malicious.

Similarly, Ann refuses to transfer class funds, continues to “advertise” previous committee notices and directs classmates to contact members no longer associated with the reunion effort. Her misinformation confuses classmates, creates division, and casts negativity over proceedings.

She has a right to speak as a classmate, however she is fraudulently projecting a position of authority. This action creates “two principals” — and two committees. I requested Ann stop. She blocked me from her Facebook page to prevent me from observing her behavior. Ann refuses to communicate with me. This behavior is malicious and causes unnecessary frustration.

The totality of this behavior is retaliatory. The three appear to be angry with me, I assume. They however refuse to communicate. Frustrating my efforts doesn't harm me. Their action cheats classmates. In fact, I have no plans to attend the reunion. Would be difficult for me to return to Idaho next year.

My sole objective it to give classmates an opportunity to vote on Reunion 50 format and agenda. I'm stunned this request caused so much nuclear armageddon. They can blame me; I can blame them. Either way, classmates lose. Highland High school loses. Your outstanding staff and culture are dragged into negativity.

I ask for your leadership. We have no process for conflict adjudication and resolution. I've requested transfer of authority and class funds; transfer of Class of 1975 Facebook page; transfer of Class of 1975 most-updated classmate roster. Cease advertising a second committee. Give us a chance.

All committee members were invited to serve with me. Invitation remains open. Immediate task of Reunion 50 committee is to rapidly connect with as many classmates as possible, vote on agenda and format, to have sufficient time to implement their selection. Cooperation wins for our classmates.

I have included an overview of the Reunion 50 position to classmates. Both Plan A, used in 40th reunion, and Plan B, an enhanced format, are presented. Time is of the essence. Ann, Jeff and Susan are intentionally delaying progress for classmates — without explanation; they refuse to communicate. I offered a Mediation Offer yesterday. They ignored the opportunity to compromise and cooperate.
